Lunch Plaza

It began five years ago with the vision of a shaded lunch plaza for Redwood students in the dusty barren area in front of the Cafeteria. Parents BJ Martin and Robin Moller came up with the idea, and Robin worked with Landscape Architect Brian Powell to produce some lovely drawings of the proposed plaza. Then came Modernization and funding issues. Last year PTSA launched a fundraising campaign for the plaza, including Redwood Rocks! 2007 and the sale of Legacy Bricks.

The project is moving along. The Board of Trustees approved the project last October, and authorized the hiring of a landscape architect. After six months of meetings, emails and plan reviews, the Lunch Plaza Committee (Eladia Laines, Laura Edwards, Robin Moller, BJ Martin, myself, LaSandra White and Nancy Neu) came up with a final design for the Lunch Plaza. The project went out to bid March 14, and the target construction date is spring 2008.

Thanks to the hard work and determination of event co-chairs Eladia Laines and Laura Edwards, we will finish the fundraising job with Redwood Rocks! 2008 and related brick sales. With their great style and spirit, Eladia and Laura have done a fabulous job running this fundraiser two years in a row. Thank you to all the parents, staff, alumni and community partners who donated to the Plaza by purchasing legacy bricks, benches, trees or tables. And thank you to the Redwood Foundation for donating \$35,000 this year!

RHSF Annual Campaign hits 40% Participation

For the first time in the Foundation's short history, 40% of the Redwood parents have donated! HOW TO WRITE THE SAT ESSAY

At this session students will learn how to set up their essay, who grades the essay, what graders are looking for, and how to write for points. This workshop is intended for juniors who are planning to take their SAT this spring. Interested students should sign up in the College & Career Center by April 15, cost to sign up is \$5 (funds help support the RHS Scholarship Foundation), and class is limited to the first 25 students.



SOPHOMORE CAREER EXPLORATION

Career Exploration using Bridges, an Internet based program, began in March during World History classes and will be finishing soon. Students were brought to the computer lab during a block period to take an interest inventory to determine their likes and dislikes. Once students identified their top two personality types they were asked to select a career from their results. Students then filled out worksheets with the following information: job selected; skills needed; education level required; earnings potential; outlook for the future (local/state/national); 2-to-5 colleges that offer the area of interest. Worksheets have been returned to students and copies have been given to their counselors to keep in their files. Parents should ask to see the results.

Once the surveys and worksheets were completed, students were encouraged to begin building a resume. They will be able to add to

the resume over their remaining time at Redwood and keep it up to date. The resume will be important when they are looking for an internship or a job this summer, and in the future when they apply to colleges and ask teachers/staff for letters of recommendation. Students are able to keep all of their work saved in their portfolio and have access to it at any time. Check out the website: www.bridges.com; site id: 0010077 and password: giants

During this time all sophomores registered on Prep Headquarters (PrepHQ) and will now have access to current information on colleges, scholarships, and summer programs. Prep HQ is one more way for us to communicate with you and your student. (See below.)

COMMUNITY COLLEGES

In March, college counselors from College of Marin and Santa Rosa JC visited Redwood High School to meet with interested seniors. Students attending either of these colleges were given information packets which included an application, enrollment cards, placement test information, and instructions on navigating the website for Santa Rosa JC.

Students attending a community college need to take both English and math placement tests. If students missed the COM test here at Redwood they should contact the Assessment Office at 485-9469 to

schedule a date. The testing schedule for SRJC is online at: www.santarosa.edu and test dates and times are listed for both the Santa Rosa and Petaluma campus. If students did not attend the meeting and need to pick up a packet they should stop by the College & Career Center.

All community colleges require placement tests and if your child will be attending a school out of the area, they should find out test dates (dates are available online) or if the college will accept one of the local community college's placement tests. PREP HQ – REMINDER

PREP HEADQUARTERS is a free web-based program used by our counseling department to communicate with students and parents. You will be able to access scholarships, summer programs, college search, SAT/ACT information, and the financial aid process as well as receive up to date information from your student's counselor regarding activities and events happening at school.

We encourage all families to register on PrepHQ. It is a simple procedure, just go to www.redwood.org and go to the counsel-

ing department link. There you will see the link to PrepHQ, click on "Click Here to Register" in the gray box on the left side. When prompted, enter the student's last name and the Redwood student ID number. Follow the registration steps and enter student and parent email address(es) to receive the latest in school communication. ■

REDWOOD SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Since 1969, the Redwood Scholarship Fund has helped more than 300 graduating seniors pursue their dreams of higher education.
